


2.5% & 1.0% COLA Increases For 2024

Effective July 1, 2024, eligible School, Judges, and Patrol retirees received a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) in their monthly benefit distributions. The COLA is calculated using the consumer price index and may be capped at 2.5% or 1.0% per plan provisions.

For the year ending June 30, 2024, the CPI increase was 2.89%. As a result, eligible School, Judges, and Patrol Tier 1 members received an increase of 2.5% and Tier 2/3/4 members received an increase of 1%.

NPERS issued correspondence to all affected retirees at the end of July. If you were eligible for the COLA increase, this letter explained the type of COLA and actual dollar amount of your increase. If you have questions about the COLA, please refer to your <u>plan handbook</u> or contact NPERS.



What is new at NPERS for 2024

We have implemented MFA (Multi-Factor Authentication) for NPERS online accounts. Multi-Factor Authentication enhances the security of your account information. This update enables us to offer expanded services and provide more information to members and agents while ensuring a more secure environment. We are excited to make our online accounts more accessible and user-friendly, all while maintaining a secure online experience.

We have a new plan to administer: OSERS! As of September 1, 2024, NPERS has taken over the administration of our seventh plan, the Omaha School Employees' Retirement System (OSERS). Including active, inactive, and retired members, OSERS currently has 15,123 participants, making it roughly the same size as the County Retirement Plan. Administering this plan has been both a demanding and rewarding undertaking, and we are very proud of this accomplishment in 2024!

We added half-day in-person events for off-season plans. This year's State and County Fall in-person seminar season featured two new half-day seminars for our Nebraska School Plan.




